## CROWLE.

CROWLE, a small but thriving market town, near the channel of the old river Don, 6 miles N. of Epworth, 17 N. by W. of Gainsbro, 12 S. of Goole, and 16 N.E. of Doncaster, increased its inhabitants from 1343 in 1801, to 1424 in 1811, to 1729 in 1821, 1889 in 1831, to 2235 in 1841, to 2548 in 1851, to 2648 in 1861 and to 3122 in 1871; and has in its township about 6000 acres of land, including the hamlet of *Ealand*, 1 mile S.E.; *Crowle Wharf*, on the Stainforth and Keadby Canal,  $1\frac{1}{4}$  mile S. of the town; and about 500 acres of moor land, lying within the Yorkshire border, and assessed to the county rates of the West Riding. Of this moor, about 200 acres have been enclosed and much improved by warping during the last 25 years. Crowle parish, which includes also Eastoft township, contains 3813 inhabitants and 7350 acres of land, much of which has been fertilized by the warping process. It is in Thorne Union and County Court District, and has a station on the Doncaster and Barnetby branch of the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire Railway. The market, formerly held every Saturday, is now only held every Monday fortnight, during the months of March, April and May; but a weekly one is held every Friday. Here are two annual fairs for cattle, flax, &c., held on the last Monday in May, and on November 23rd, or old Martinmas-day. The biennial cattle fair is now discontinued. A public Market Hall, over which is an assembly room, was opened here in 1870 by a limited company, with a capital of £1450, in £5 shares. William Potts, Esq., is treasurer, and Mr. William Hemingbrough is *secretary*. A Local Board was established here in 1865. William Potts, Esq., is *chairman*, and Mr. Thomas Hodgson, *clerk*. The Burial Board, established in 1862, provided a general cemetery, which is pleasantly situated in the suburbs of the town. The town is well lighted with gas from Works erected here in 1854, by a company of shareholders with a capital of £1800 in £10 shares. Mr. John T. Brunyee is *secretary*. The old Don is now only a small brook, but the surrounding country is so intersected on every side by drains, canals, and embankments, as to give it the appearance of a Dutch settlement. The growth of potatoes, &c., and the cultivation and dressing of flax, find employment for many of the inhabitants. During the last 25 years the town has been much improved. Earl Manvers is lord of the manor of Crowle, and he and the Brunyee, Maw, Carnochan and Hilton families are the chief owners of the soil. In 1747, the body of a woman was found at the depth of six feet, in the Peat Moor, near Crowle, (but in Amcotts township,) in an erect position; and though, from the antique sandals on her feet, she appeared to have been there several centuries, her hair and nails were as fresh as when living; and the skin was soft and strong, though of a tawny colour. The Church (St. Oswald), which retains a little of its original Saxon architecture, is a large stone structure, consisting of nave, aisle, chancel, and tower with three bells. The chancel was thoroughly restored in 1856, and it contains a stained glass window, in memory of Mrs. Mary Brunyee, of Sand Hall. The living is a vicarage, valued in K.B. at £14 10s., and now at £1100, in the patronage and incumbency of the Rev. Frederick William White, B.A., J.P. The Rectory is in the impropriation of R. P. Johnson, Esq.; but the tithes were commuted at the enclosure, in 1813, when about 500 acres were awarded to the vicar. There are in the town four chapels, belonging to the Wesleyan and Primitive Methodists, the Independents, and the General Baptists. Three houses, with extensive common-rights, and ten acres of land, were bequeathed to this parish, for the education and relief of the poor, by Richard Brewer, in 1687; Thomas Walkwood, in 1692; and Richard Clark, in 1721. The land and commonrights were exchanged at the enclosure for 21A. 3R. 10P. of tithe-free land, and the sum of £206. The latter was expended in repairing the buildings, and the whole estate is now let for about £60 per annum. These charities are now appropriated by the Charity Commissioners to the National School; and the trustees are the Rev. W. Duncombe, and J. Brunyee, G. S. Lister, J. Horncastle, and W. F. Cocking, Esquires. A School Board was elected in 1871; Cornelius Maw, Esq., is *chairman*, and Mr. Thomas Turner Pearson, *clerk*. *Tetley Hall*, in Crowle township, is now occupied by Mr. G. Robinson, and is approached by a fine avenue of trees; but was formerly the residence of Henry Lister Maw, Esq., whose ancestors were long seated here, and one of whom suffered martyrdom at Lincoln. *Sand Hall*, about a mile S.W. of the town, is the seat of W. Brunyee, Esq.

EASTOFT, a pleasant village and township, in Crowle parish, on the south side of the small channel of the old Don, opposite a place of the same name in Yorkshire,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles N.E. of Crowle railway station, and 9 miles from Goole. It contains 1273A. 1R. 2P. of land, and increased its inhabitants from 128 in 1801 to 151 in 1811, to 232 in 1821, to 224 in 1831, to 282 in 1841, to 460 in 1851, to 534 in 1861 and to 691 in 1871. The other Eastoft township is in Adlingfleet parish, Yorkshire, and contains 1389 acres and about 100 souls. The Yorkshire township belongs to H. Strickland Constable, Esq.; but Earl Manvers is lord of the manor of the Lincolnshire township, which belongs chiefly to the Rev. Thomas H. Lister; but a number of copyholders and a few freeholders have small estates here. The two townships have recently been constituted ecclesiastically a separate district parish, in the diocese of York. The Church (St. Bartholomew), which stands on the Yorkshire side of the village, is a handsome structure, in the Early English style of architecture, erected in 1855, at an expense of £5000, solely defrayed by Lady Strickland, who endowed it with £150 per annum, and also erected at the same time a National School and a neat Parsonage House. It was designed by Mr. G. L. Pearson, of London, and consists of nave, chancel and turret, with three bells. The Church, which is neatly fitted up, contains 400 sittings, and many of its windows are embellished with stained glass. The benefice is a vicarage in the gift of H. S. Constable, Esq., and incumbency of the Rev. William T. Humphrey. The New Connexion and Primitive Methodists have small chapels in the Lincolnshire part of the village. Letters *via* Goole, but the nearest Money Order Office is at Crowle.
