**CROXBY** is a very small village and parish, on the wolds, 3 miles west from North Thoresby station on the East Lincolnshire section of the Great Northern railway, and about the same distance east from North Kelsey station on the Lincoln and Hull section of the Manchester, Sheffield and

Lincolnshire railway, 5 1/2 south-east from Caistor, and 9 north-east from Market Rasen station on the Lincoln, Cleethorpes and Hull branch of the Manchester, Sheffield and Lincolnshire railway and 10 south-west from Great Grimsby, in the East Lindsey division of the county, parts
